

DOCUMENT CHECKLIST GENERAL SKILLED MIGRATION (SUBCLASS 189/190)



PLEASE PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING TO PREPARE YOUR GENERAL SKILLED MIGRATION APPLICATION

1. Documents to support your expression of interest

- (a) An up to date CV covering at least 10 years;
- (b) A suitable skills assessment from the relevant skills assessment authority;
- (c) English test results from a specified English language test, you took in the three years immediately before you were invited to apply;
- (d) Employment reference letters, payslips, tax records and employment contract for each period of employment you wish to claim points for;
- (e) A copy of your education certificates and academic transcripts;
- (f) A letter from the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters (NAATI) that you have been accredited by NAATI at the paraprofessional level or above for interpreting or translating (if relevant);
- (g) A suitable skills assessment from your partner (if relevant).

2. Evidence of your relationships

- (a) Full birth certificate for each family member (translated if not in English);
- (b) Evidence of health assessments (if required);
- (c) Police certificates for any country (including Australia) if they are over 17 and have lived for a cumulative period of 12 months or more);
- (d) If married, full marriage certificate (translated if not in English);
- (e) If in de facto relationship:
 - i. Evidence of shared finances (bank accounts)
 - ii. Evidence of living together (lease);
 - iii. Evidence of shared social aspects of relationship (photographs, emails).
- (f) If children are between 18 and 23, evidence of financial dependency:
 - i. Proof that they reside int he same household (E.g. correspondence to the same address);
 - ii. Proof that they are financially dependent (e.g. bank statements);
 - iii. Proof that they are studying (E.g. university enrolment).
- (g) If including a child under 18 where a parent is not included, evidence of custody (legal documents and Form 1229).

3. Documents to demonstrate your identity, health and character

- (a) Biographical pages of current passports or travel documents;
- (b) Evidence of your health assessment (if required);
- (c) Police certificates for any country (including Australia) if you have lived for a cumulative period of 12 months or more since turning 16);
