Australia's General Skilled Migration (**GSM**) program is used by the Australian government to fill skill gaps in the Australian economy by targeting specific occupations and people with relevant skills and experience.

What are the GSM visa types?

There are three primary visa which fall under the General Skilled Migration Program:

- 1. Skilled Independent Subclass 189;
- 2. Skilled Nominated Subclass 190; and
- 3. Nominated or State Sponsored (Provisional) Subclass 489.

The 189 and 190 visas are direct permanent residence visas whilst the 489 is a temporary visa which can lead to permanent residence when additional eligibility criteria is met.

What does this mean for Systems Analysts?

Systems Analysts are listed on the Australian government's Medium to Long Term Strategic Skills List. This means this occupation is in high demand in Australia, and eligible for the above visa types.

This document provides an overview to the eligibility requirements for Systems Analysts.



FIRST STEP: WHAT IS A SYSTEMS ANALYST? DO YOU FIT THE DEFINITION OF ONE?

A Systems Analyst is defined by the Australia New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO) as an individual who undertakes the significant majority of the following tasks:

- 1. working with users to formulate and document business requirements
- 2. identifying, investigating, and analysing business processes, procedures and work practices
- 3. identifying and evaluating inefficiencies and recommending optimal business practices, and system functionality and behaviour
- 4. using project management methodologies, principles and techniques to develop project plans and to cost, resource and manage projects
- 5. taking responsibility for deploying functional solutions, such as creating, adopting and implementing system test plans, which ensure acceptable quality and integrity of the system
- 6. creating user and training documentation, and conducting formal training classes
- 7. developing functional specifications for use by system developers

- 8. using data and process modelling techniques to create clear system specifications for the design and development of system software
- 9. acting as a central reference and information source, providing guidance and assistance in the system project decision making process
- 10. evaluates processes and methods used in existing ICT systems, proposes modifications, additional system components or new systems to meet user needs as expressed in specifications and other documentation.

A Systems Analyst must also have qualifications equivalent to a n Australian bachelor degree or higher qualification. At least five years of relevant experience and/or relevant vendor certification may substitute for the formal qualification.

SECOND STEP: CAN YOU OBTAIN A POSITIVE SKILLS ASSESSMENT?

A Systems Analyst is assessed through the Australian Computer Society (ACS). The ACS application is logged online. For the purposes of a GSM application, you must meet one of the following, listed in order of preference:

- 1. Post Australian Study: An Australian Bachelor degree or higher with a major in ICT which is closely related to the nominated occupation (ANZSCO) plus 1 year of relevant post qualification experience or completion of an ACS professional year;
- 2. Bachelor Degree or Higher with a closely related ICT major: You will need to demonstrate 2 years relevant work experience completed within the past 10 years or 4 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history;
- 3. Bachelor Degree or Higher with an ICT major (not closely related): You will require 4 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history to meet the suitability criteria;
- 4. Bachelor Degree or Higher with a closely related ICT minor: You will require 5 years relevant work experience completed in the past 10 years or 6 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history;
- 5. Bachelor Degree or Higher with an ICT minor (not closely related): You will require 6 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history to meet the suitability criteria.
- 6. Diploma or vendor certification with a closely related ICT major: You will require 5 years relevant work experience completed within the past 10 years or 6 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history;
- 7. Diploma or vendor certification an ICT major (not closely related): You will require 6 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history.
- 8. Non ICT Diploma or Higher: You will require 6 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history, plus a suitable Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) application;
- 9. Work Experience Only: You will require 8 years relevant work experience completed anytime in your past work history, plus a suitable Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) application

All experience will need to be evidenced with employment reference letters and skills with certified copies of your qualifications / academic transcripts.



THIRD STEP: SKILL SELECT AND THE POINTS TEST

Unlike most visa applications which can be applied without invitation, an online platform called SkillSelect is used to manage the skilled migration program.

What is SkillSelect?

SkillSelect is split into two components:


- 1. an Expression of Interest (EOI); and
- 2. if you comply with all relevant criteria, an Invitation to apply for the visa.

Once an EOI is submitted online through SkillSelect the system will automatically

provide you with a report of your score against the points test based on information you have provided.

How many points?

You will require a minimum of 60 points to be invited to apply for the visa. The below diagram sets out the points assessment.
